

# 2005 CMHA Hospital Education Support Survey

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## Introduction

Hospitals in the nation are key to the nursing education process, through their participation in and support of clinical education and rotations. The level of support is especially strong in the urban based markets. Despite this clinical support, such hospitals are not currently recognized nor reimbursed for the roles they play in nursing and allied education, in contrast to the Medicare reimbursement mechanisms established under graduate medical education participation. Also, it is understood that clinical education for nursing was once reimbursable at an earlier time when most nursing programs were hospital-based for both didactic and clinical training.

Further exploration of this education issue meets a real need for members of CMHA, has widespread appeal, and would encourage the continuation of hospitals' role as clinical affiliates at a time when the workforce shortage is acute and pressures to expand education are mounting.

The CMHA first discussed the nursing education issue at its August 2003 board meeting, where a motion was passed to pursue and explore further through the Human Resource group. The HR group first considered this topic at its October 2003 meeting, discussing survey dynamics and next steps for action. In 2004 sample surveys were gathered, partners were approached, and vendor options considered. The HR group has served as a steering group for the survey development. Astron Solutions, a national Human Resource consulting firm from New York, was contracted in November 2004 to conduct the survey.

One hundred thirty five (135) organizations participated in the web-based survey. All data are effective as of May 20, 2005.

## Survey Methodology

Completed survey questionnaires were reviewed by Astron analysts for completeness and quality. Astron followed up as needed with participants to verify and clarify ambiguous responses and data anomalies. Astron then conducted the statistical analyses the foundation of this report.

<b>Number of Responses</b>	The number of organizations reporting data for the question.
<b>Total Number of Responses</b>	The sum of responses reported by all organizations.
<b>Average (Mean)</b>	The sum of all data divided by the number of organizations reporting data.
<b>P25 (25<sup>th</sup> Percentile)</b>	The rate within the sample that is higher than 25% of all the rates reported.
<b>P50 (50<sup>th</sup> Percentile)</b>	The rate within the sample that is the middle value of all the rates reported (also known as the median).
<b>P75 (75<sup>th</sup> Percentile)</b>	The rate within the sample that is higher than 75% of all the rates reported.
<b>Amount</b>	The sum of all dollar amounts reported by respondents.

## Comments about the Total Amount of Other Hospital Financial Support for Nursing

- Financial aid and tuition reimbursement.
- Planning time for collaborative programs with area schools of nursing.
- The hospital foundation paid \$93,000 in 2004 toward tuition reimbursement for all employees, the bulk of which is (approx. \$40,000) for nursing education.
- Nursing scholarships.
- Seminars for staff on mentoring and preceptoring.
- FY 2004 was an operating loss for the Nursing School owned and operated by our faculty.
- Salary for two part-time librarians.
- Reimbursement for seminars and education.
- Refreshments, recruitment materials.
- Nursing Scholarships for students.
- Estimate of time for Unit Managers to coordinate Nursing Student activities. Estimate of time/expense for secretarial support of maintenance of schedules. Staff time spend in reviewing and supervising the care provided by nursing student in our facility.
- We provides clinical rotation programs for nursing students. The students work with our staff and use supplies as needed but we do not keep track of these costs as a separate account since staff is being paid as part of their regular work hours and the equipment being used is part of our patient care.
- Help to subsidize the school program.
- The hospital pays for student parking.
- Our hospital helps defray the cost of the local nursing school. Instructors are on hospital payroll. The total is the financial commitment to the nursing school.
- We provide one year of work experience, the nursing student is 'buddied' with an RN and is NOT part of our calculated HPD (budget). We also give cash \$500 a semester to student nurses. We also have a 20/40 program where the student is given a stipend while in school and maintains full benefits and salary during school time.
- We sponsor a 'Care Conference' for graduating RNs. This conference is where the students work in teams and present a nursing research project.

# Financial Support of Nursing and Allied Health Programs (8)

## Comments about the Total Amount of Other Hospital Financial Support for Nursing (continued)

- Our hospital has nursing students perform clinical rotation at our facility. These students are instructed and supervised by the instructors from their educational institution.
- We have a scholarship loan program where we will grant up to \$15,000.00 per student for Nursing School. We average 15 per year at an average cost of \$11,000.00 each.
- Faculty Forum program, senior nurse seminar - programs providing information and networking offered each year. Cost represents approximate cost to put on the programs.
- Our hospital has committed \$35,000 per year through the California Hospital Association & the local community college to support nursing education.
- Outside seminar/workshop registration and travel expenses. Internal Programs, i.e.. Palliative Care, WOCN education, CC computer based training, OR internship education.
- Snack for feedback sessions with students to evaluate the clinical experience.
- Two hours spent at meetings attended by Director of Patient Care Services. Nursing School Advisory Board.
- Project LINC students in formal education programs for LVN to RN, RN to ADN or BSN.
- Cost of building and furnishing two new nursing laboratories to increase RN seats at university (\$200K). Cost of furnishing clinical classroom for accredited LPN program at Hospital (\$50K).
- Since each organization operates in a unique manner it is very difficult to quantify the numbers as requested.
- Nursing Student Clinical Hours usually include time assigned to clinical nurse for 6-8 hour clinical either as patient assignment or nurse preceptor. This student/nurse partnership is in addition to nurse patient assignments and unpaid resourcing of students. Need to implement TB Fit Testing for Employees and Students to comply with OSHA standards at \$50/eval. Currently cost prohibitive. 400 for Student Nurse Recruitment Function.
- The bulk of the expense of the Nursing & Allied Health (radiology) students are handled by their School/University.

## Comments about the Total Amount of Other Hospital Financial Support for Allied Health

- Planning time for collaborative programs with allied health schools.
- Clinical instructor seminars.
- Estimate of time for Unit Mangers to coordinate Respiratory Therapy Student activities. Estimate of time/expense for secretarial support, of maintenance of schedules. Staff time spend in reviewing and supervising the care provided by nursing student in our facility.
- We provides clinical rotation programs for allied health students. The students work with our staff and use supplies as needed but we do not keep track of these costs as a separate account since staff is being paid as part of their regular work hours and the equipment being used is part of our patient care.
- The hospital pays for student parking.
- The hospital has a forgivable loan program of \$30,000 per year for a 2-year program. We accepted two students in 2004 for a total commitment of \$120,000.
- Allied Health program is run through a coordinator not paid by the hospital for local high school students interested in a healthcare career. With the exception of providing a classroom space and allowing the students to rotate and observe various units/departments, no other additional support is provided.
- Scholarship loan program as above for Diagnostic Imaging, Ultrasound, and Respiratory Care. We average 6 per year at an average cost of \$8,000.00 each.
- We provide a \$5 meal ticket to every PT, OT, or Speech Therapy Student for lunch every day of their clinical rotation at our hospital.
- Outside seminars or workshop registration and travel expenses.
- Graduation expenses/supplies for Radiology.
- Our facility pays two full time staff for our Radiology School. The functions of the jobs are administrative, classroom instruction, and clinical supervision. The salaries are \$45,822 and \$36,961 annually.
